IMPORTANT EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

"Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith."

ENTRIES CLOSE MAY 3rd, 2020. All entries POSTMARKED after May 3rd will be subject to a late fee of \$30.00 per horse. Entries not RECEIVED on or before May 22nd will be charged a late fee of \$45.00. Please note, these late charges will be enforced for everyone.

Entry, drug and stall fees must be paid in full at time of entry and accompany entry form. FAXED OR EMAILED ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. During the show, for horses that are already entered, post entries must be made one session prior to the class being entered. No splitting of fees on any entry blank. In the event of a cancellation necessitated by severe weather or other emergency, entry fees will not be refunded. The term "entry" may not be used when an owner qualifies more than one horse in a championship class. Enter one horse which might be shown and you may make a substitution with another qualified entry at no charge.

CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFICATIONS: Exhibitors must enter and show in the respective section for each championship. Cross entering is allowed between the Classic Pleasure and English Pleasure Divisions and Classic Pleasure Driving and Pleasure Driving Division, if shoeing requirements are met. **LADIES CLASSES:** All entries in ladies' classes will be eligible to show back in their respective amateur championship if they were qualified by an amateur. **LIMIT RIDER CLASSES:** All entries in limit rider classes will be eligible to show back in either their respective limit rider or age group championship.

SCRATCHES: An exhibitor failing to scratch an entry at least one hour prior to the session in which the class is scheduled will be assessed a \$25 scratch fee. All scratches must be made on the official scratch form and signed by the secretary. Money for qualifying classes is not refunded but may be put

toward another class. Management reserves the right to cancel or combine or split any class. Class changes will be posted in the Secretary's office.

BILLING FEE: A \$25.00 fee will be charged to any exhibitor or farm who must be billed after the show.

RETURNED CHECK FEE: There will be a \$50.00 handling charge for all returned checks and/or declined credit cards.

REFUNDS: Refund request made before the closing date of entries; May 3rd, 2020 will be made in full. Entry fees will be refunded due to an injury/casualty to a horse or exhibitor, or an immediate member of the exhibitor's family <u>only</u> when the exhibitor provides the show secretary with a veterinarian or doctor's certificate no later than the start of the show. Stall fees and office fees will not be refunded for any reason after the close of entries May 3, 2020.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: A HEALTH CERTIFICATE DATED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE START OF THE HORSE SHOW WILL BE REQUIRED BY THE EASTERN STATES EXPOSITION FOR ALL HORSES ON THE GROUNDS, EVEN IF THEY LIVE IN THE STATE OF MASSACHUSSETTS, AND EVEN IF THEY ARE NOT BEING SHOWN.

ALL HEALTH PAPERS WILL BE EXAMINED.

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health requires that no equine over 6 months of age is permitted at any horse show in the Commonwealth unless it is accompanied by a negative Coggins Test which was conducted within the previous 12 months. Foals under 6 months of age shall be exempt from the requirements provided that the foal is with its dam and the dam is accompanied by an official negative Coggins test.

It is also required that all the horses must have a certificate to prove the Eastern and Western Equine Encephalitis vaccination has been administered. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by competition management. Please refer to USEF GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule for complete rules.

US EQUESTRIAN MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT:

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45.00 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF FEE: Every horse participating shall pay a \$23.00 Federation fee (\$15.00 shall be the equine drugs and medications fee).

SHOW PASS FEE: \$45.00 Not available to those showing amateur – amateur's MUST be a member.

*As of January 1, 2019, every USEF adult member (18 years of age or older) must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training. Those who do not complete the training will be ineligible to compete in USEF activities, including this competition.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: There is a \$50.00 charge per horse for horses that are stabled on the grounds and not entered and shown in any classes. This fee is in addition to stall fees.

STABLING 620 permanent stalls with doors are available. Show management cannot guarantee the same stall location from year to year. There will be no additional stabling. Due to the stabling limitations, early entries are advised. No initial bedding provided.

MORGAN ENTRIES: Horses in this division must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association Inc., the Canadian Morgan Horse Association, or the British Morgan Horse Society, and must be entered under their full registered name or, if under one year of age, be eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or lessee or record with the AMHA, CMHA, or BMHS. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of least must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry. Competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement. Owners, trainers, and riders must be members of AMHA.

No stripping in any championship classes.

FRIESIAN ENTRIES: Individuals signing the USEF Entry Agreement (i.e. rider, driver, handler, agent of an owner, and trainer) for horses competing in the Friesian division must be members of the International Friesian Show Horse Association or pay a non-member fee to IFSHA for each competition. All Friesian horses competing in Friesian classes must have an IFSHA number not just Friesian registration papers.

ADDING CLASSES: Please note that Management will not consider adding any class to the schedule without a minimum guarantee of two entries to show in the class and a sponsorship of \$100 which must be paid prior to the added class.

DRESSAGE/WESTERN DRESSAGE: All dressage classes will be held in the dressage ring located behind the coliseum on the Eastern States

Exposition grounds. The footing is sand. Warm up footing is sand or grass. Management reserves the right to change the location of the arena prior to the start of the show if needed. Stabling in D and F barns is recommended due to their proximity to the dressage ring. Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct USDF numbers for rider, horse, and/or owner or a non-member identification number. Scores count towards Adequan/USDF All-Breeds Awards.

PRIZE MONEY DISTRIBUTION: A trophy and eight ribbons will be awarded in all classes. Prize money will be mailed to the owner within 30 days of the last day of the show. Prize money checks must be cashed within 30 days of the date issued. Prize money will be distributed from the applicable classes as follows:

CHAMPIONSHIPS: Award trophy and eight ribbons and prize money as noted.

FOOTING: The coliseum show arena is 100' x 200' and is sand footing. The outside show, dressage & warm up rings are sand footing. Carriage is grass footing. Dressage footing is sand. Warm up footing is sand or grass.

HORSE ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: The grounds will be open to exhibitors and horses at 9 a.m. on Monday, June 1st, 2020 until SUNDAY, June 7th 2020.

<u>*NO HORSES WILL BE ALLOWED ON</u> <u>THE SHOW GROUNDS UNTIL</u> <u>MONDAY, JUNE 1st*</u>

BOX SEATS: Will be available during the entire course of the show at the rate of \$125.00 for six (6) seats.

CAMPER ARRIVALS: Campers or horse trailers with living quarters will be parked in the area

designated by the management. Camper stickers will be issued at the gate by Eastern States. The fee to be paid at the show office is **\$240.00** for Monday, June 1st, 2020 through Sunday, June 7, 2020; **\$325** for campers requiring 50-amp service. Early arrival campers can move in on Sunday, June 1st, 2020 but must pay a \$20 per night early arrival fee at the gate; \$50.00 per night for 50-amp service. Fees are paid at the show office, except for \$20.00 early fees, which be collected at the gate for Sunday arrivals.

SHARPS DISPOSAL: Sharps disposal containers are located throughout the barns. It is trainers, owners, and exhibitor's responsibility to dispose properly of sharps. Management reserves the right to fine individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

LUNGING of horses is not permitted in the coliseum.

QUIET TIME will be in the coliseum the first hour after the conclusion of the afternoon session.

CLASS HOLD POLICY: A standard two-minute hold will be granted to exhibitors that request a hold an hour before the start of the session. Hold requests will only be granted by management. There will be no exceptions. Holds will be announced at the start of each session so exhibitors can plan accordingly.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: In accordance to USEF GR901.29; Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

FIRE & SAFETY REGULATIONS: The following regulations must be adhered to in accordance with the Town of the West Springfield Fire Regulations and Public Safety Code:

- 1. No smoking allowed in barns or coliseum. Strictly enforced.
- 2. No open flames allowed in any building.
- 3. All fabrics used as backdrops and/or display must be flame retardant.
- 4. Burlap material is not allowed for display.
- 5. Bark much is not allowed for display material.
- 6. Large Wood chips or coarse bark mulch may be used in barns but shall be kept damp at all times.
- 7. No motorized gasoline/diesel vehicles.
- 8. All exits and fire lanes shall remain free and clear at all times.
- 9. No excessive accumulation of litter or rubbish.
- 10. All aisles shall be a minimum of 10" in length
- 11. Aisle Displays widths are not to exceed:
- 12. Main aisles 30" from each side
- 13. Side aisles 24" from each side
- 14. All children 12 years of age and under must wear a helmet while riding a bicycle
- 15. No roller blading or skate boarding.
- 16. No glass bottles or containers.

DIRECTIONS TO SHOWGROUNDS EASTERN STATES EXPOSITION: FROM CONNECTICUT AND POINTS SOUTH Take I-91 North from Rte. 2, I-84, I-95 or the Merritt Parkway — Follow I-91 North to Mass. Exit 3 to Route 5 North to Rte. 147 West, Memorial Avenue approximately 3/4 mi. to ESE's Gate 9 parking lot.

FROM BRADLEY INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Take Rte. 75 North to Rte. 147 East. Continue approximately 1/2 mile to ESE's Gate 9 parking lot.

FROM VERMONT AND POINTS NORTH

Take I-91 South to Mass. Exit 13B, to Rte. 5 South, to Rte. 147 West. Continue approximately 3/4 mi. to ESE's Gate 9 public parking lot.

FROM BOSTON AND POINTS EAST

Massachusetts Turnpike West to Exit 4, to Rte. 5 South to Rte. 147 West. Continue approximately 3/4 mi. to ESE's Gate 9 parking lot.

FROM THE BERKSHIRES AND POINTS WEST

Take the Massachusetts Turnpike East to Exit 4, to Rte. 5 South, to Rte. 147 West. Continue approximately 3/4 mi. to ESE's Gate 9 parking lot.

Riders in this division are students who are currently taking lessons and are to be judged on their basic riding skills. The age of the rider must be listed on the entry blank. Headers for lead line riders must be at least 18 years of age. Horses that are used are to be lesson horses (see horse eligibility). Horses are not to be judged. Class splits will be made at the manager's discretion. There will be minimum holds allowed. Please be prepared to enter the ring when the class is called.

Entries: All Academy entries must be done on separate Academy entry blank.

Rider Eligibility: A rider may not enter in any other division at the show. A rider who has shown in a regular division or in a full riding suit at any show is prohibited from participating further in the Academy Division, with the exception of the Show Rider Classes. Once a rider has competed at any level wearing a full suit, they are ineligible to compete in academy classes at any point thereafter; the rider can however show in Show Rider Classes in the season(s) following the season in which the rider showed wearing a full suit.

Horse Eligibility: All horses/ponies used in Academy classes must be used regularly in lesson programs. All breeds are welcome. Horses used in Tournament classes can cross enter into the regular horse show classes with different riders.

Rider Attire: Helmets approved for horseback riding (not bicycle helmets) are mandatory for all exhibitors. Riders must wear appropriate boots.

Saddle Seat – Kentucky jodhpurs, boots, shirt, and vest. No full saddle suits are allowed.

Hunt Seat – Breeches, boots, and hunt shirt. No coats allowed.

Western Seat – Western jeans or slim-fitting pants, long sleeve shirt with tie.

Pelham bridles, or full bridles may be used (martingales allowed). There are no shoeing

restrictions or requirements. Protective boots are allowed. Braiding is optional.

Classes will be divided between seats if entries warrant. If it becomes necessary to split classes into A and B sections due to shared horses, Section A of both classes will be run consecutively, then Section B, to reduce tack and rider changes.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits</u>: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Member Guide or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.<u>Membership Requirements for</u> <u>USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized</u>

<u>**Competitions:</u>** Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEFlicensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDFrecognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.</u>

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDFrecognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEFlicensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.

Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

MEMBERSHIPS DEFINED:

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDFrecognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEFlicensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF.

The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed. Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR does not need to be renewed.

HOW TO JOIN USDF:

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations: On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office. In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds. By calling or writing the USDF office at (859) 971-2277, 4051 Iron Works Parkway, Lexington, KY 40511. The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.
